Our planet has finite resources, incapable of sustaining the needs of a population of 9.7B people by 2050, with 3B more middle-class consumers by 2030. The currently prevailing linear economy system based on an unlimited exponential growth and a take-make-dispose model is not sustainable and cannot guarantee the life of many businesses and industries whose supply comes from non-renewable resources. Society needs re-think and re-design the way we work at all levels of the manufacturing process.

About the project

U-Eco is an innovative project that focuses on the process of transition towards a Circular Economy, addressing the need for a specific Circular Economy training capable of boosting employability, self-employment and meeting the new labour market demands. By identifying areas with more potential for growth as well as job profiles that will be demanded in the next decade, U-Eco aims at supporting individuals in acquiring and developing the right skills and competences to meet the growing demands from the labour market. Additionally, U-Eco will prioritize the goal of boosting self-employment in the Circular Economy context by supporting the setting up of, and access to, key upskilling pathways.

This included:

Environmental, social and economic problems linked to linear economy were identified.

Comprehensive market study covering market scope, market growth rate, costs structure and market profitability in a Circular Economy context was carried out.

Capacities of existing SMEs, their potential to act as service providers in the Circular Economy sector and identification of capacity gaps and their potential for market development were mapped.

A detailed SWOT analysis of the identified business solutions and the assessment of investment opportunities were developed.
