
# AVOID THE MOST COMMON RECYCLING ERRORS

# Errors in the **yellow** container



Plastic Toys (Grey container or given to charity)
Baby bottles, pacifiers (dummies)

– in the grey container
Kitchen utensils
Plastic buckets – in the grey container

### Errors in the **blue** container



Briks/Cartons – Yellow container
Daily waste – kitchen towels, dirty paper
– brown container
Nappies – grey container

# Errors in the green container



Light Bulbs – taken to a recycling drop off/collection point Mirrors, ashtrays, glasses or plates, taken to a recycling drop off/collection point

#### What are **mixed containers** and how should we separate them?

Containers that are composed of more than one material are considered **mixed containers**, and they usually generate doubts with the consumer on how to recycle them.



Carefully check the instructions on the packaging.







If there are no indications or instructions, take into consideration the majority material and deposit the packaging in the container designated for that material.
