Products in the wrong containers

Improper waste

Choose the majority material to determine the correct container.

Errors in the **yellow** container



Plastic Containers
Cans
Briks/Cartons



Plastic Toys (Grey container or given to charity)
Baby bottles, pacifiers (dummies)
– in the grey container
Kitchen utensils
Plastic buckets – in the grey container



Errors in the **blue** container



Paper containers
Cardboard containers



Briks/Cartons – Yellow container
Daily waste – kitchen towels, dirty paper
– brown container
Nappies – grey container



Errors in the **green** container



Bottles or blown glass,
not to be confused
with normal glass



Light Bulbs – taken to a recycling
drop off/collection point
Mirrors, ashtrays, glasses or plates,
taken to a recycling drop off/collection point



What are **mixed containers** and how should we separate them?

Containers that are composed of more than one material are considered **mixed containers**, and they usually generate doubts with the consumer on how to recycle them.
